Exterior -Your home's first impression

- Remove pet waste
- Keep children's and pet's toys picked up
- Put away gardening equipment
- Clean up garden beds
- Spread fresh mulch
- Mow and fertilize the lawn
- Trim trees and hedges
- Add colorful plants
- Remove and/or replace dead landscaping
- Tighten loose gutters
- Attend to sagging/torn screens
- Paint, if needed, including trim
- Remove cobwebs on the front porch
- Clean or repaint the front door
- Sweep the driveway and walkways
- Purchase new house numbers
- Buy a new welcome mat



Interior -Yay! You've lured the buyers out of their car

(Keep them captivated and wanting to see more)

- Fix leaky plumbing
- Fill cracks and holes in the walls
- Clean/repaint scuffed baseboards
- Paint the walls a neutral color
- Replace dated faucets
- Scrub tile in the kitchen and baths
- Launder curtains and bedspreads
- Remove oversized furniture
- Ensure contents of each room match its purpose
- Store bulky and excess linens, apparel
- Remove all personal mementos and photos from walls
- Clean and vacuum floors
- Have carpets cleaned if necessary
- Replace outdated cabinetry pulls/knobs
- Clean the home from top to bottom
- Wash the windows, inside and out
- Get rid of odors
- Clean and deodorize carpets
- Clean appliances and fixtures
- Neatly arrange closet and cupboard contents
- Clear kitchen and bathroom counters
- Replace any burnt out light bulbs
- Provide 100 watts of light for each 50-sq. ft. of room space
- Lock up or remove valuables, medications, weapons and jewelry
- Store excess items offsite if possible
